

To ensure all enjoy their time at Mattishall Golf Club, the committee respectfully asks that the following rules and dress code be observed:

Dress Code

To gain access to our golf courses the following is expected:

- · Shirts have collars and sleeves (except tailored mocks designed for golf)
- · No blue denim trousers, football/rugby shirts, sports shorts or tracksuits
- · No trainers, only golf shoes
- · Socks must be worn, inner and ankle socks allowed
- · Shirts to be tucked into trousers/shorts at all times
- · Tailored trousers and shorts only

This dress code is a condition of membership or of purchase of a green fee.

Mobile Phones

• Mobile telephones are not to be used on the courses except for 999 emergency calls. Please ensure your telephone is switched off at all times.

Club Rules

- · Avoid slow play at all times. If you believe your ball might be lost, play a provisional straight away.
- · If you are unable to keep up with game in front, please call the game behind through, if you are holding them up.

Etiquette

- Repair your divots
- · Repair all pitch marks
- · Replace rake after use in bunkers parallel to line of play to green
- Do not take trolleys/buggies inside marked demarcation of aprons or greens or onto the tee boxes
- · Behaviour should be in accordance with expected Mattishall Golf Club Etiquette at all times
- · Spectators and walkers are not permitted on the course except for when accompanying junior players

Competitions

- You are expected to arrive in good time, be on the tee and be ready to play by your allotted tee time or face disqualification
- You are reminded you must check your current handicap on the board on the day of your competition before completing your scorecard
- · Once the draw is made if you fail to show you will still be charged your entrance fee
- Markers are responsible for the accuracy of a player's scorecard, whilst you are responsible for your handicap details. The Marker is responsible for correct completion of the card including the awarding of any penalty strokes incurred during the course of each hole. You, the player, ultimately sign for correct representation of your score before your scorecard is submitted.
